OUR NEW CHURCH: A Progress Report

It has been more than 2 years since SCF began the search for a new home in mid-2020. There have been lots of challenges along the way but the significant goal of creating an inspirational new space for our worship services will soon be achieved. It is indeed a very exciting time.

R&H Construction began work on July 25 and has been making great progress since then. Demolition has been completed and framing of the raised platform, sacristy, new walls and new doorways is complete. The next several weeks will be occupied with electrical rough-in, plumbing rough-in, fire sprinkler system modifications, and HVAC ductwork modifications. Later in September, wallboard work will begin followed by painting and finish work in October and November. R&H presently projects completion by December 1.

A dedicated group of volunteers has served on a sanctuary design review committee for the past six months. They have interacted with ORW Architecture, reviewed options, provided feedback, and made necessary decisions regarding the sanctuary design and its furnishings. New stackable chairs and other furnishings for the sanctuary have been ordered and should arrive in late November or early December.

The project is tracking well with the budget and available funds. We are very grateful for the generosity of the congregation and thank those who have already submitted their 2022 pledged donations. Payment of outstanding 2022 pledges by the end of September will greatly assist with managing cash flow for the project.

Thank you to the entire congregation for your enthusiastic support of the project.

The lock box code will be shared by Wade Watson only with those on a very short list. If you need meeting space for an SCF group or activity, there are two cost-free options.


1. A meeting room in the business park very near the temporary church office. This can be scheduled through Rob Pearson.

FALL ADULT LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES

One of the anticipations for our new church home is to again provide adult learning opportunities. This fall, Feminine Spirituality will continue to meet on Mondays from 10 a.m.-Noon in the Sunriver Library. The Men's Tuesday group will resume on September 20, 7:30 a.m., Pozzi Center at the Nature Center.

Later this fall, two courses will be offered following the worship service, upstairs at SCF. The first one will be led by the Rev. Roy Green entitled "*Truth and Reconciliation: Discussion of the Doctrine of Discovery*," October 23, 30, and November 6. The second is an Advent study titled "*The Amazing Cousins*," an overview of the unique birth experiences of both John the Baptist and Jesus, led by Pastor Rob. It will meet December 4, 11, and 18. Further details on both classes will be shared soon.

Once our remodeling project has been completed, we are looking forward to more classes beginning in early 2023.

At this point we hope to resume choir practices by the middle or end of November in order to participate in worship services during the Advent-Christmas season. However, the above two conditions are the "final determiners" when a starting date can be announced. We will keep you posted.



SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM UPDATE

All scholarship awards for our 15 recipients have been mailed to their respective schools. Five of the recipients, on the semester system, already resumed classes in mid-late August. The remaining ten start their fall term in mid-late September. As you have the opportunity, pray for them as they move forward this school year towards their ultimate graduation objective.

Due to COVID challenges, fundraising for this program has been limited to individual donations and a few grants. The Scholarship Committee hopes to initiate some other fundraising strategies during the upcoming school year. The Scholarship Program receives no SCF budgeted money. However, the Endowment Program has generously provided funds for the program over the past several years. Most of the funding comes from outside sources. SCF FREE WHEELCHAIR MISSION Campaign for 2022

The Free Wheelchair Mission Campaign for SCF will be carried out this year during the month of September. The price of the wheelchairs will be the same as in the past: \$96. This year we will collect funds for the campaign during the complete month of September and will be sending the money to the Free Wheelchair Mission during the first week of October when the mission operates their two-for-one matching program. This year when you donate money for a wheelchair your money will purchase two wheelchairs.

It is amazing to me that the \$96 cost actually gets the wheelchair manufactured, delivered to one of 94 countries around the world and delivered to the person that will use that chair to give them the mobility that will allow them to get up off the ground and out of their home to become a vital part of their community.
