

The Scripture Lessons

Lector The words of prophets in ancient times, and in ours, are often unsettling, sometimes harsh. Prophets are truth-tellers, not fortune-tellers, and their words arise in times when the people have lost their path with God. However, the words of the prophets also contain messages of hope, true good news. This reading from Jeremiah is such a cherished prophecy.

A reading from the Prophet Jeremiah (31:31-34)

The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt—a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the Lord. But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, "Know the Lord," for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the Lord; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more. *The Word of the Lord*

A Moment for Meditation

Psalm 119:9-16 Please read responsively.

9 How shall a young man cleanse his way? *

By keeping to your words.

10 With my whole heart I seek you; *

let me not stray from your commandments.

11 I treasure your promise in my heart, * that I may not sin against you.

- 12 Blessed are you, O LORD; * instruct me in your statutes.
- With my lips will I recite * all the judgments of your mouth.
- 14 I have taken greater delight in the way of your decrees * than in all manner of riches.
- 15 I will meditate on your commandments * and give attention to your ways.
- My delight is in your statutes; * I will not forget your word.

Lector This morning, we step into the life of Jesus as he predicts the coming final conflict. Not only are forces aligning against him, but some of his followers are beginning to fall away. For many, his teaching, his way, was just too demanding, too dangerous. So we hear this morning Jesus confessing that his soul is troubled.

Please stand as you are able for the reading of the Gospel.

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John (12:20-33)

All Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Now among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honor.

"Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say—'Father, save me from this hour'? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name." Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again." The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, "An angel has spoken to him." Jesus answered, "This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. Now is the judgment of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself." He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die. *The Gospel of the Lord*
