Call to Worship

Celebrant: Sometimes it takes us a while to get here. Not just into the room but into this moment. Into this breath. Into this body that carries the weight of the week.

All: So we pause and we open our hearts to whatever the Spirit might be stirring in us.

Celebrant: On the day of Pentecost, the Spirit stirred up wind and flame, not to put on a show, but to draw people in, to help them hear each other, maybe for the first time.


All: The Spirit met them right where they were and she meets us here, too.

Call to Confession

Celebrant: Pentecost reminds us that the Spirit still speaks— but sometimes, we tune her out. We hold back instead of reaching out. We speak sharply, or stay silent when love requires courage. We protect our pride and avoid the risk of being changed. So let us be honest before God. Let us pray.

Prayer of Confession

All: Holy Spirit, We confess we often make things harder than they need to be. We cling to what we know instead of trusting your movement. We speak without love. We avoid those who challenge us. We turn down the volume on your voice. Forgive us. Soften what is rigid in us. Open what is closed. And help us live with hearts tuned to your grace.

Amen.

Assurance of God's Grace

Celebrant: Hear this promise from scripture: "I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh," says the Lord. Not just on the holy or the put-together but on all people. On the young and the old. On the ones who speak boldly, and the ones who are still finding their voice. This is the good news: God's Spirit is already with you. Already working in you. And nothing, not your fear, your failure, or your past can keep you from the grace of Christ.

All: Thanks be to God. Amen.

Celebrant: The peace of the Lord be always with you.

All: And also with you.

Scripture Readings Jann

A reading from Romans 8:14-17

Reader: The Spirit makes us children of God.

For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God.

For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, "Abba! Father!"

it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ, if we in fact suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

A reading from Acts 2:1-21

Reader: Filled with the Spirit

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place.

And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting.

Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them.

All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every people under heaven living in Jerusalem.

And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each.

Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans?

And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia,

Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes,

Cretans and Arabs--in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power."

All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine."

But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Fellow Jews and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say.

Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning.

No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

'In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams.

Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit, and they shall prophesy.

And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist.

The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day.

Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.'

Reader: Holy Spirit, Gather up these prayers, spoken and unspoken, and carry them to the heart of God. Renew us for your work.

This table is for all who are hungry for belonging, all who are thirsty for grace. Come—not because you understand, but because you are understood. This is Christ's table. And there is room for you.

Celebrant: Celebrant: The Lord be with you.

All: And also with you. Celebrant: Lift up your hearts.

All: We Lift them to the Lord.

Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Celebrant: It is right to praise you, God of fire and breath. You hovered over chaos and called forth life. You led your people through fire and wilderness. You spoke through prophets, visionaries and truth-tellers. And when the time was right, you poured yourself into flesh, Jesus, who welcomed the outcast, healed the hurting, and broke bread with many.

When he died, your Spirit did not leave us alone. She came rushing in; unpredictable, uncontainable, to breathe life into the Church. And so, we sing:

We serve communion by intinction, where you are invited to take a piece of bread, dip it into the cup, and receive the elements together. Gluten-free and individual sterile options are available.


Prayer after Communion

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM UPDATE

The SCF Scholarship Committee is happy to announce their awarding of 11 scholar-ships, totaling \$24,600, to young people from our area who are seeking higher education opportunities. Seven of these recipients are "reappliers," having already received at least one scholarship from SCF in the past, and four are "first-timers." This is the 15th year of the program and to date, \$385,400 in scholarship assistance has been awarded. The committee is also happy to announce that Steve Phares is now the new chair of the committee.

EUCHARISTIC VISITORS

SCF is re-instituting the Eucharistic Visitation (EV) ministry that was put on hold during the pandemic. Some of you may not be familiar with this ministry but its members assist Pastor Kally in attending to our parishioners unable to attend Church. EV's receive training in how to provide the consecrated elements of the Body and Blood of our Lord to those in our family who are unable to attend church but to whom those elements and connection to SCF mean so very much. If you are looking for a very personal "hands on" ministry this one is for you. Having been a part of this Ministry for the past ten years I remain humbled that 30 to 45 minutes of my time can provide such a lift in the life of a member of our SCF family. An EV visit is normally done by a team of two that serve for two weeks every few months. We are hoping to find 9 or more of you who are willing to take on this most rewarding and important ministry.
